



Future leaders debate Nationalism among youth takes centre stage at SRM Public School

Chennai, Aug. 3: The growing importance of nationalism among youth emerged as one of the key themes at the Future Leaders Debate Summit (FLDS) 2026, organised by SRM Public School as part of its 10th anniversary celebrations. More than 320 students from 33 schools across Chennai and neighbouring districts participated in the inter-school championship, conducted in the Modified World Schools Debate Championship format to promote critical thinking, analytical reasoning and respectful, evidence-based discussions. Among the various contemporary topics debated, nationalism among youth generated lively discussions, with participants presenting diverse perspectives on balancing patriotism, constitutional values, global citizenship and social responsibility. Students supported their arguments with research, rebuttals and logical reasoning, reflecting their awareness of current

social and national issues. The summit also featured debates on net neutrality, mandatory community service in schools, lowering the voting age, peer pressure among adolescents and whether emotional intelligence should be introduced as a core school subject. In addition to conventional debates, students took part in innovative events such as Silent Debate, Media Room Challenge, One Minute Fire and Leadership Café, designed to enhance communication, teamwork, leadership and decision-making skills. The championship attracted 24 teams in Category A (Classes IX and X) and 31 teams in Category B (Classes XI and XII). Speaking at the valedictory function, Dr. Sridhar Krishnaswami, Scholar-in-Residence and Visiting Professor at Sai University, emphasised that reasoned debate and ethical journalism play a vital role in shaping informed

and responsible citizens. Guest of Honour K. Ramachandran (KRC), former City Editor and Chief Reporter of The Hindu, highlighted the need for students to develop analytical, communication and leadership skills to meet future challenges. In Category A, Shree Niketan Patasala, Mannivakkam, emerged champions, while San Academy, Tambaram, finished runners-up. Velammal Vidyalaya, Kolapakkam, received the Best Emerging Team award. In Category B, Sree Gokulam Public School, Chengalpattu, won the championship, BVM Global secured the runners-up position, and Loknayak Jayaprakash Narayan Vidyalaya, Guduvancheri, was adjudged the Best Emerging Team. The summit concluded with the presentation of trophies and certificates, reaffirming the school's commitment to nurturing informed, socially responsible and nationally conscious future leaders.

Teen author debuts with Rajendra Chola novel

Chennai, Aug. 3: A 16-year-old Class XII student has made his literary debut with a Tamil historical novel on Emperor Rajendra Chola, aiming to introduce a new generation of readers to the Chola empire's maritime legacy. Rounaak Shiv, who writes under the pen name Andhuvan, launched Aazhikondan – Rajendra Chola, the Conqueror of Oceans – Part 1 at Crossword Bookstore in Express Avenue Mall, Chennai. The book, published by Vanathi Pathipagam and translated into Tamil by



Dr K.V.S. Maruthumohan, traces the rise of Rajendra Chola's military campaigns, overseas conquests and the transformation of the empire into one of the world's leading maritime powers. The author describes the work as "factual fiction", blending

historical records and epigraphic references with fictional storytelling to recreate the personalities and events of the era. Rounaak said his interest in history began with stories narrated by his grandmother and later deepened through reading Ponniyin Selvan and studying Chola history, inscriptions and heritage. He said the novel was an attempt to remain faithful to historical evidence while bringing the period alive for contemporary readers. The book was unveiled by Ramkumar Ganesan, son of legendary actor Sivaji Ganesan, while the first copy was presented to retired physician Dr Manju Bala from Philadelphia, USA.

The launch was attended by personalities from the fields of literature, cinema and medicine, with Dr Vanathi Ramanathan delivering the welcome address and Dr K.V.S. Maruthumohan introducing the novel. The event was hosted by Kavimamani Tamilmugil Thiruvai Babu.



IIIT Sri City awards degrees to 328 students at 10th convocation

Chennai, Aug. 3: The Indian Institute of Information Technology (IIIT) Sri City, an Institute of National Importance, celebrated its 10th Convocation by awarding degrees to 328 students, including 10 Ph.D. scholars and 318 B.Tech. graduates. The degrees were conferred by Prof. S.R. Mahadeva Prasanna, Director (Additional Charge), in the presence of faculty members, students, parents, alumni and distinguished guests.

Padma Bhushan awardee and Bharat Biotech Managing Director Suchitra Ella, who was the chief guest, delivered the Convocation Address. The ceremony was presided over by Prof. Ramesh Venkateswaran, Chairperson of the Board of Governors, and attended by Board members, including Sri City Chairman Srinji Raju.

Addressing the graduates, Suchitra Ella urged them to become "persons of value" rather than merely chasing success. She stressed the importance of resilience, integrity, lifelong learning, innovation and the responsible use of emerging technologies. She also encouraged students to dream big and contribute meaningfully to society. She praised the vision of Srinji Raju and Sri City Managing Director Dr. Ravindra Sannareddy in developing a world-class industrial ecosystem and highlighted IIIT Sri City's growing role in innovation and nation-building.

Prof. Ramesh Venkateswaran advised the graduating students to use their education for the country's development, embrace ethical leadership and remain connected with their alma mater. Presenting the Annual Institute Report for 2025-26, Prof. Mahadeva Prasanna said the institute achieved a placement rate of 92.1 per cent, with an average annual salary package of Rs 17.82 lakh and the highest package touching Rs 1.2 crore. He also highlighted major achievements, including record Ph.D. admissions under the MeitY Visvesvaraya Scheme, publication of 34 international research papers, patents, recognitions from DRDO and NIOT, and the successful organisation of UDBHAV, the national Inter-IIIT Hackathon.

Corp Commissioner reviews monsoon preparedness at subway monitoring centre

Chennai, Aug. 3: Greater Chennai Corporation Commissioner Dr. G.S. Sameeran, reviewed the city's monsoon preparedness by inspecting the Integrated Command and Control Centre at the Ripon Building campus and monitoring surveillance systems used to track waterlogging in subways. As part of the inspection, the Commissioner reviewed the real-time monitoring mechanism to ensure that any accumulation of rainwater in subways is detected and addressed promptly. He later inspected the Gengu Reddy Subway near Nehru Park on Poonamallee High Road to assess flood preparedness. During the visit, he examined the rainwater collection sump, pump room and other infrastructure designed to prevent waterlogging and instructed officials to intensify monitoring and ensure all systems remain fully operational. Officials informed the Commissioner that the city has 24 subways, including 19 maintained



by the Greater Chennai Corporation and five under the Highways Department. He directed officials to ensure continuous surveillance of all subways, keep rainwater collection tanks and pumping systems in a state of readiness, and take timely action to prevent water stagnation and ensure uninterrupted traffic movement during the monsoon. Dr. Sameeran also instructed

all zonal Deputy Commissioners, engineers and field officials to maintain round-the-clock monitoring and respond swiftly to any rain-related issues to minimise inconvenience to the public. Chief Engineer Sankaravelu, Supervising Engineer Elango and other senior officials accompanied the Commissioner during the inspection.

Sri Ramachandra Institute marks World Breastfeeding Week with awareness programme

Chennai, Aug. 3: Sri Ramachandra Institute of Higher Education and Research (SRIHER) launched its World Breastfeeding Week celebrations with the theme "Breastfeeding for a Sustainable Start in Life: Strengthen What Works," highlighting the importance of breastfeeding for maternal and child health. The week-long programme was inaugurated by acclaimed Tamil film lyricist Yugabharathi, who stressed that breastfeeding is not only the best source of nutrition for infants but also strengthens the emotional bond between mother and child. He said breastfeeding helps prevent several health problems during early childhood and contributes to a child's overall well-being. Calling for greater public awareness, he said universal breastfeeding practices could be achieved only through sustained awareness campaigns in both urban and rural areas. He also noted that the theme of motherhood holds a special place in his film lyrics, reflecting the invaluable role of mothers in society. Delivering the keynote address, Dr. Manju Bala Dash, National Trainer (Infant and Young Child Feeding-IYCF), Local Coordinator of the Breastfeeding Promotion Network of India (BPNI), and Head of the Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecological Nursing at Mother



Theresa Post Graduate & Research Institute of Health Sciences, said studies have shown that breast milk improves a child's cognitive development, intelligence and immunity. She pointed out that inadequate family support and aggressive marketing of infant formula and supplementary milk products often discourage mothers from exclusively breastfeeding for the first six months. Expressing concern over the decline in India's exclusive breastfeeding rate from 63.7% to 55.8%, she called for stronger awareness campaigns and support systems for breastfeeding mothers. The week-long programme features academic sessions, community outreach initiatives and public awareness activities involving faculty members, students and healthcare professionals. It aims to promote evidence-based breastfeeding practices, encourage greater public participation, raise awareness

among mothers and families, and strengthen collaborative healthcare delivery through multidisciplinary engagement. The programme is jointly organised by the Departments of Paediatrics, Neonatology, Obstetrics and Gynaecology, Paediatric Nursing, Community Health Nursing, the Lactation Research Team, Faculty of Nursing, Clinical Nutrition, Lactation Support Nurses, the Nursing Team of Sri Ramachandra Hospital and Medical Centre, and the Faculty of Occupational Therapy. Among those present were Vice Chancellor Dr. Uma Sekar, Dr. Saji James, Head of Paediatric Medicine, Dr. P. Anitha, Assistant Professor of Paediatrics, Dr. B. Uma Maheshwari, Head of Neonatology, Dr. A.J. Hemamalini, Head of Clinical Nutrition, Nursing Superintendent Ms. Kala, Ms. Selma Thomas, along with faculty members and students from various departments.
